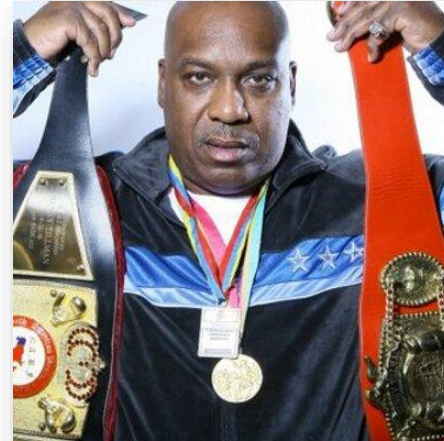

Positive peer groups. Respect is earned and given to those who work hard.

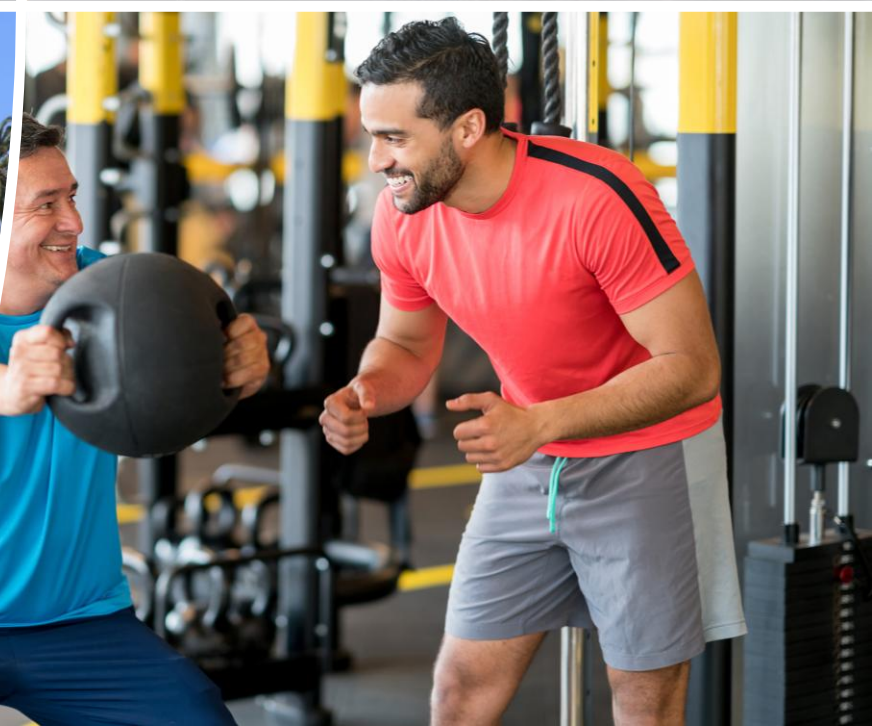


Strong mentor relationships. Coach is there to guide you, protect you and make you the best version of yourself.

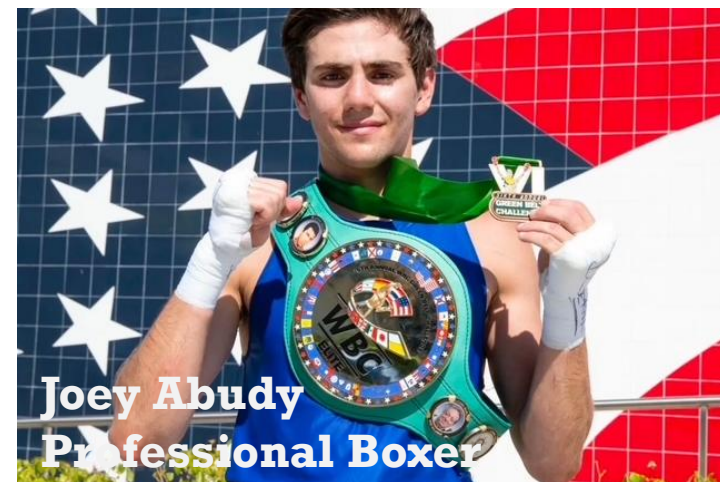

WE PRODUCE WINNERS

- Richy Ruiz is a Los Angeles Police Department Cadet. He is one of many boxing students from our program who has chosen law enforcement as a career. We produce young men and women with courage, who are ready to protect and serve.
- Isaiah Hale, a El Segundo High School graduate began boxing at 15 years old. Now at 25 years old, he is an NYU graduate and US Army Officer and Green Beret. He credits his boxing training a discipline as a youth fin preparing him for the rigors of military life.
- Joey Abudy was 16 years old when he began in our program. Constantly in fights and smoking marijuana, he was "lost" according to him. Once he found boxing, he turned his life around. He was ranked #2 in the USA as an amateur, finished with a record of 60 wins 10 losses and is now a top professional prospect with a record of 10-1.
- Victor Hernandez started boxing at 16. He currently attends El Camino Community College. In 2024 ECC and Sweet Science formed a Collegiate Boxing Club. In 2026 Victor Hernandez became ECC 1st National Champion beating out boxers from Army, Navy, Michigan, Washington and other top schools.
- Irene Diaz started at age 14. She is a Hawthorne High School graduate. Now at age 21, she is one of the most decorated female amateur boxers in California history. She us currently training with team USA in preparation for the 2028 Olympic Games.

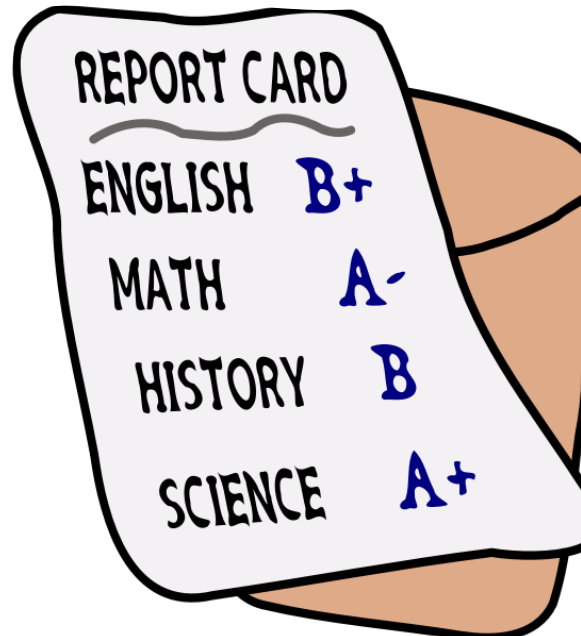

COMMUNITY IMPACT

- To be awarded a no-cost gym membership, candidates must complete the following 3 task. These task are designed to build a synergy between the boxing gym, the potential athlete and the community.
 - Education is the cornerstone of upward mobility; local economics build a more vibrant community and law enforcement and citizens must humanize each other to build a personal connection.
- 1) Education – Candidate must posses a 2.0 GPA or above.
 - 2) Support your local business – Candidate must perform 1 hour a month of community service with a locally licensed and established business.
 - 3) Police – Candidate must spend 30-45 minutes with a local police officer.

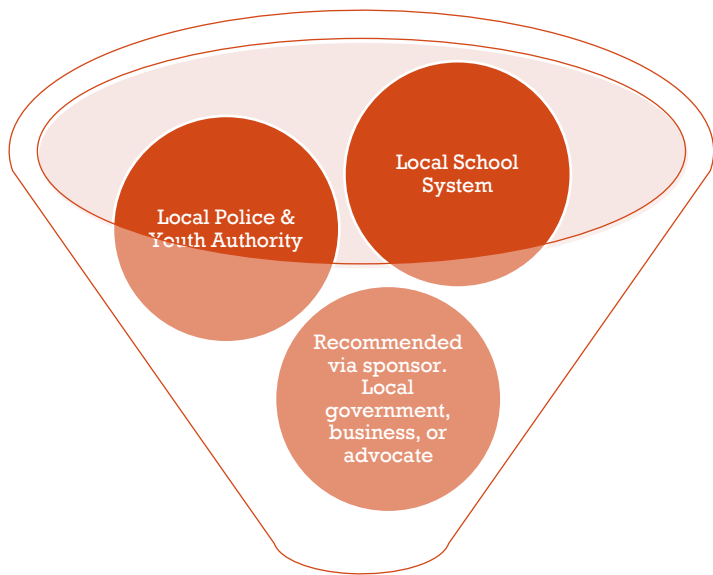
